Shauna talks about her last supper on page 12. This would be a great journal prompt.

• Why does food matter to you?

On page 15, Shauna describes how her friend, husband, and father connect with God (nature, music, and water, respectively). Shauna connects to God's voice and spirit by creating opportunities for the people she loves to rest and connect and be fed around the table.

Do you feel comfortable or welcome in the kitchen?
